FROM THE VICE-PRESIDENT

ling this month. She'll be back in time for our Wednesday, February 22, monthly meeting. In the meantime, I wouldn't begin to presume what she would want to write about this month, but I have a few thoughts of my own. I'm guessing they aren't far from Bobbi's. Here are just a couple of random observations of where we are, what we have done, and what we need to do.

The situation in Washington, D.C., with the Trump Administration gets worse every day. I hesitate to even comment, as with each day some new travesty emerges. This president insults our allies, threatening friend and foe alike, both domestically and internationally, and has moved the Nuclear 'Doomsday Clock' to the closest it's been to midnight in 64 years, since the height of the Cold War. We at Beach Cities Democrats demonstrated this determination with our endorsement last month of Bill Brand for Redondo Beach Mayor and Todd Lowenstein for City Council, as well as Yes on Redondo Beach Measure C. We also demonstrated it this past summer and fall when we worked tirelessly to keep our courageous Congressman Ted Lieu representing us in Washington, and to send Al Muratsuchi back to Sacramento to represent us here in the 66th AD. Al's victory ensured the all-important 2/3 Super Majority of Democrats in the Assembly, keeping California solidly "Blue."

Soon after he spoke, Muratsuchi's Senior Field Representative Andrew deBlock came up to the podium and presented Dency with a Certificate of Recognition for his tireless service in helping Al get elected. Not only was Dency honored with the award, but it was also discovered to be his birthday, so we celebrated the occasion and shared a fabulous birthday cake.

Manhattan Beach City Council The only candidate for this office in attendance was Diane Wallace, who served as director of a statewide literacy program, and has been an active civic

Redondo Beach City Council, District 4 We heard from three candidates:

Suzv Rovds. who said she had supported Measure C (described below). She had been a lifelong Republican but has Adam Wachter recently registered as a Democrat:



John Gran, who lives in North Redondo and says he would focus on improvements to the South Bay Galleria and the Artesia corridor;

Adam Wachter, who opposes Measure C, but is interested in redevelopment of the Galleria.

Our votes did not yield a 60% majority

for any of the candidates, so there was no endorsement.

Gardena City Council

Gardena Mayor Mark Henderson Pro Tem Mark



Henderson spoke next. In July, he replaced Mike Tanaka, who has been indicted and removed from the Council. Henderson said he would conduct meetings that engage the community and encourage input from the attendees. Endorsed

Measure C

This measure is designed to limit the overdevelopment of the Redondo Beach Waterfront, and its tag line is "Revitalize, not Supersize." We heard from two people in support of the measure and two opposed.

Supporting:

Bill Brand said the measure is important to reduce the size of the redevelopment on the Waterfront, protect the Seaside Lagoon, and limit the proposed multi-

layer parking structure.

Todd Lowenstein said we don't need more retail, and doubts that it would draw shoppers away from the nearby malls. He also believes the development could pose a traffic problem. Opposing:

Ken Petrulis and Christian Horvath spoke

against Measure C. Ken Petrulis called the measure intellectually dishonest.

Opponents generally believe the measure would thwart voters' intent when they voted on Measure G in 2010, which would limit overdevelopment, and that we should focus on fixing the failing infrastructure at the Redondo Harbor. The club voted to endorse Measure C.

Measure H

Proponents say the measure will provide \$350 million in aid to the homeless in Los Angeles County. A kick-off for the measure was held recently at the PATH Supportive Housing complex in Los Angeles. The measure would levy a quarter-cent sales tax to aid our homeless people, including Veterans.

Tony Hale spoke on behalf of the measure, pointing out that it "helps the least among us," and shows what Democratic values are about.

Endorsed

Tony also offered to do a 30-second Robocall on behalf of our endorsed candidates, Bill Brand and Todd Lowenstein. Diane Wallace.
