Environmental Priorities Program

A man who spent 71 days living in a 400-year-old tree to save it will be the special speaker on the present administration's environmental policies on Tuesday, September 14, 2004.

John Quigley, activist and educator, will speak before the Environmental Priorities Network at the Pacific Unitarian Church, 5621 Montemalaga Drive, RPV, at 7:30PM. BCDC and the Church's Social Justice Committee are cosponsors of the event.

Born in Minnesota, Mr. Quigley grew up in the Washington, D.C., area. He studied drama at Cal State, San Diego, and then moved to Los Angeles where he found too much density and pollution and became an environmental activist. The tree he attempted to save was "Old Glory," an oak tree on Pico Canyon Road in the Newhall Ranch area of the Santa Clarita Valley. He was in the tree until forcibly removed by sheriff's deputies. His actions were to show what the power of one person can do in the fight to

With little more than two months left before the election, we have our most important job ahead of us.

We must reach every voter in the 100 precincts in our cities. Instead of those annoying dinnertime phone calls, we want to put a warm person at the door of every household. We want to carry our message so that no voter is left behind.
