

February Recap

Looking Toward November

Our February program included meeting new candidates and hearing from old friends.

Marci Winograd, president of the Progressive Democrats of Los Angeles, introduced herself as a challenger to Congresswoman Jane Harman. Winograd, a teacher, is a longtime opponent of the Iraq war and was instrumental in getting an anti-war resolution passed at last year's California Democratic Convention. She said that Democrats who voted for the war are not secure in office. We need to recapture the party of Eleanor Roosevelt and Bobby Kennedy. She favors immediate withdrawal from Iraq and investing the war billions on social programs for education, health care, and housing.

Next we heard from Russ Warner's campaign for Congress in the 26th District. His campaign manager, Scott Haas, said that Democrats need only 16 House seats to take back Congress. Warner's eldest son Greg, after returning from military service in Iraq, urged his father to run for office to support the troops while honoring our veterans. The owner of a successful magazine distribution company, Warner pledges to support small business as the engine of the new American economy and to work for a sensible Iraq withdrawal policy.

Furutani has endorsements from Jane Harman, Debra Bowen, Mayor Antonio Villaraigosa, Ted Lieu, and several trade unions including SEIU. He has served on the Los Angeles School Board and the LA

Community College board of Trustees. An activist since the 60s, he worked to establish admissions programs for minority students at colleges and universities throughout the United States and helped establish ethnic studies programs and departments on campus.
