We all know the bad news: Bush won the presidency nationally with 286 electoral votes to Kerry's 252. He also took 51.3% of the popular vote, to Kerry's 48.3%. Nader received only a paltry 0.3%, partly due to his not making it on the ballot in some states including California. If it's any consolation, Kerry won 54.4% of the California vote and 62.8% of the Los Angeles County vote.

The good news begins with the electoral contests in California and especially in our area. The detailed results are shown in the following tables. In summary, the Democrats kicked butt in all but one race, and that one, Rohrabacher(R) vs. Brandt(D) wasn't

## October Recap

### One More Month

In this our last meeting before the election, not the rainstorm nor the Red Sox kept members at home. Our usual big crowd showed up to share last-minute updates and announcements prior to the election.

### Children's Authors for Kerry

Our main speaker was April Halprin Wayland, a politically active author of children's books. She believes the reason there are so many activists in politics now is that the children of the baby boomers



have grown up, freeing their parents to become more than "checkbook liberals." She has organized a group called Authors and Illustrators for Children ([www.AiforC.org](http://www.AiforC.org)) whose ad reads, "We create children's books because we care about children. That's why we're voting for John Kerry."

The ad is running in education magazines and on teacher-oriented websites throughout October. Wayland said her goal was to receive an email from just one person telling her that he or she switched from Bush to Kerry because of her work. (She reached her goal.)

She has been interviewed on cable radio programs and is listed on Michael Moore's website. Her group now includes 375 authors including award-winning Maurice Sendak and Judy Blume.

Ms. Wayland is also a poet, a musician, an organizer, and a teacher. She currently teaches in the UCLA Extension Writers' Program.

## News & Announcements

Shirlee Browne reported that our treasury is up over \$5,000 and we have already paid for a large ad that is to appear in the Beach Reporter and the Easy Reader. Bob Barnwell said the current issue of Easy Reader also has a good writeup on Mike Gordon's campaign and the smear tactics being used by his opponent, Greg Hill. Mike has been endorsed by the Daily Breeze.

We heard from Victoria Page, fiancée of Kurt Schmalz, that the Redondo Beach councilman is running for mayor in the March 8 election. She invited club members to the campaign kickoff on October 30.

Vice-president Lee Fink announced his race for Redondo Beach City Council in the same election. Lee grew up in Orange County and went to law school in New York, but he says BCDC feels like his family.

Bill Briggs from Mike Gordon's campaign told us that opponent Greg Hill is so desperate that 95% of his mailers are devoted to attacking Mike. The effect on Mike's campaign is not known, but he has been running well ahead throughout the race. As always, we can't afford to take this contest for

granted. Gordon's team is planning a victory party at the Doubletree Hotel.

Stephanie Zarro urged members to join Jane Harman's beach bike ride on October 30. Even if it rains, the pre-election celebration will take place at 3PM at Guy Dill's Studio, 1321 Innes Place, Venice.

Our longtime member Bob Brigham announced that a cartoonist friend had produced several political drawings, which were free to all takers.

Jim Aldinger gave an update on GOTV efforts. The past weekend, 350 people went to Nevada and 150 to Arizona. On the upcoming weekend, they are seeking volunteers for Nevada and Arizona. It costs only \$35 to take the bus and many homes are available to house volunteers free of charge.

Aldinger said there are now twenty phone lines operating seven days a week at his house. This evening the calls were focusing on African American voters in Florida.

He announced a training session for poll watchers. Volunteers will meet at regional locations on election day, check rosters to see who voted, and contact people who have not.

Dilip Adarkar spoke about his recent trip to England and India, his second since the Iraq invasion. He said the British are showing less goodwill to Americans because of President Bush.

without question, irreconcilable.

The world faces a situation that cannot be resolved by the UN or any other authority. The Palestinian Authority under Arafat does not control its own people. The Israelis have created a singular miracle: Democracy in the Middle East. It could work much better without the need for constant military defensive tactics against an implacable enemy. Israel has been severely criticized by Europe for build-

ing a defensive wall between themselves & the Palestinians. The critics are the same folks who stood by & many helped walk Jews through the gas chambers during the Holocaust. They claim the wall restricts the freedom of the Palestinians & absorbs some of their territory.

Omar Kayyam wrote: "The Moving Finger writes & having writ moves on..." In the Middle East the moving finger is dipped in blood & oil & hatred & killing & slaughter! For many years I hoped for some kind of solution, even an unfair one that could stop the bloodshed. Today, I see no silver lining in this cloud; there is no prayer of a possible agreement; there is no chance to "split the baby ala Solomon." I like to think of myself as an optimist, but the best I see is a never-ending, ongoing continuation of religious warfare, bloodshed, & violence. This is not a happy ending to a continuing disaster!

Next issue we can again discuss political matters & the newly elected officials, from the President on down.
