
This is the fun and fabulous event of the year! A chance to mix and mingle with our elected officials and fellow Democrats from across the South-

November Recap

President Bobbi opened the meeting calling for a round of applause in the wake of our very successful midterm election. We should all be very proud of ourselves for the Blue Wave that swept the nation and, particularly, in California. She asked new people to introduce themselves, and there were four, including a member of Rescue our Waterfront.

The next order of business was to renew our club charter, which requires the signatures of our paid-up members, although an individual may only sign the charter application for one club. Those who have signed for another Democratic club cannot also sign for BCD.

Dency reported that there are five Democrats on the Hermosa Beach City Council and five on the school board. He said that on the following day (November 29), outgoing Hermosa Beach Mayor Jeff DuClos would step back into his role on the City Council while Mayor Pro Tem Stacey Armato would become the Mayor and Councilmember Mary Campbell the Mayor Pro Tem.

Elected Officials

Joey Apodaca, Ted Lieu's field representative, spoke next. He thanked us for our strong support of Ted, who easily won re-election. High on the Congressman's agenda is the war in Yemen; he was one of the first House members to push for an end to US support for the Saudi operations in Yemen. Now that there is a Democratic majority in the House, there is hope for an end to US involvement in "the worst humanitarian crisis in the world."

Ted was also proud to be elected cochair of the Democratic Policy and Communications Committee (DPPC). Joey said that Ted has written a letter, joined by Congressmembers Doug LaMalfa, Julia Brownley and Brad Sherman, urging leadership on the House **Appropriations** Committee to authorize federal funding to assist people impacted by the devastating Camp, Hill and Woolsey fires in California.

Ted joins his colleagues in the House and Senate in calling for a further investigation of the murder of journalist Jamal Khashoggi.

Continuing the positive news, Redondo Beach Mayor Brand announced that he had prevailed in the various lawsuits that were launched by CenterCal and its supporters against those who had supported Measure C (Rescue our Waterfront). Three of the suits were (Continued on page 3)

defended by the City of Redondo Beach, but one was personal and required Bill to raise funds for his defense. The judge recognized that the plaintiffs were shills for CenterCal and thus ruled in favor of the defendants. The next step is to seek to recover legal costs.

The lawsuit alleged that Brand and Councilman Nils Nehrenheim conspired to control the political action committee Rescue Our Waterfront, and that the PAC made a mistake in not filing paperwork as an issue committee rather than a general purpose committee. On both counts the judge ruled against the plaintiffs.

John Gran

The Redondo Beach City Councilman spoke about plans for upgrading the Galleria. The approved redevelopment project would add over 200 thousand square feet of retail space, including stores, shops, restaurants and entertainment. The plan also includes 300 affordable apartment units. In response to neighborhood criticism, the Galleria agreed to move the apartment building from the site's western boundary along Kingsdale Avenue to the eastern boundary on Hawthorne Boulevard.

Christian Horvath

Fellow Councilman Horvath talked about pending legislation: a smoking ban in public places, restrictions on places selling tobacco products, and a ban on polystyrene containers in supermarkets and other outlets that sell food. He also talked about the Metro Green Line, which is still in the planning stages. Eleven options are on the table.

Todd Lowenstein

Councilman Lowenstein spoke about Community Choice Aggregation, which would allow local governments including cities and counties to purchase electricity in the wholesale power market and sell it to their residents and businesses at competitive rates as an alternative to that purchased by Southern California Edison. SCE would continue to deliver electricity, maintain infrastructure, and bill consumers. He said Manhattan and Redondo Beach have CCA, and Hermosa Beach may adopt it.

Election Recap

Bobbi said that we won all of Orange County and in total: 40 House seats, seven governorships, and 349 State Legislative seats. California makes up 8.1% of the national vote, with eight million more Democrats voting. We won all the California Congressional seats as well as the governorship and now have a super majority in both houses of the California State Legislature. Our new governor Gavin Newsom won in Orange County, where no Democrat has prevailed since 1978. Nancy Pelosi and Steny Hoyer will now be the top two leaders in Congress. Karen Bass will head the Congressional Black Caucus and Hakeem Jeffries will now be the Democratic Caucus Chair.

We are thrilled that Proposition 6 was defeated. Ted Lieu's Blue Momentum PAC helped put Democrats over the top. Dency Nelson commended Lee Fink (a former BCD president) for tirelessly working in Orange County to get out the vote.

Tony Hale spoke next, and said he had managed Betty Lieu's successful campaign for Torrance School Board. She was the top vote-getter and first Asian American woman to get elected in Torrance.

Announcements & Adjournment

It was announced that our annual Holiday Party will be at the Hermosa Beach home of Ray and Carolyn Waters on January 19 from 5:00 to 9:00.

The 66th Assembly District will be electing seven men and seven women to represent us. These representatives attend the conventions and Party meetings. We discussed the cost of attending a convention, which is borne by the delegate. There is the cost of transportation to those conventions that are not local, hotels, and the \$130 fee to attend.

Tony Hale, who is our representative

in the 66th AD committee, reporting from the County Committee, said the LA committee is the largest in the country. He said that the conventions typically run for three days, and there are three other E Board meetings a year. The next Convention is to be held in San Francisco. He also

said there have been charges leveled against our California State Democratic Party chair (who has subsequently resigned) and that there is an independent investigation taking place. The female

vice-chair will take his place until a new Chairperson is elected at the State Convention in May.

Our club will be electing new leadership in June. We will form a slate committee in April, who will announce the slate in May, and the election will be at our June meeting.
